



There's An App for That! Gale Databases from the DINFOS Library




iPhone 6 display

You can now use your mobile device to access Gale Databases with the *Access My Library* app!



- Step 1 - Download the app to your mobile device (get it from *App Store* or *Google play*).
- Step 2 - Open the *Access My Library* app.
- Step 3 - Select your Library type - Military, then Military Academic.
- Step 4 - Select Defense Information School.
- Step 5 - Enter the Gale Database password (contact the Library to get the password).
- Step 6 - Enter search terms or select a specific database or eBook.
- Step 7 - Select **Tools**  to email, download, print or save.
- Step 8 - Congratulate yourself for being awesome and using Library resources!

- * More than 13,000 topic overviews
- * More than 12,600 charts and graphs, along with other statistical information
- * 300+ profiles of federal agencies and special-interest groups
- * Full-text newspapers and periodicals from multiple perspectives, including *National Review*, *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *Commentary*, and *CNN Wire*.


