SUBJECT: Authorized/Unauthorized Cold-weather Uniform Wear

1. In accordance with AFI 36-2903, *Dress and Personal Appearance of Air Force*, and AETC Supplement 1, the following uniform items have been authorized/not authorized to wear by the Detachment Commander.
2. Para 5.1.3 – The plain short sleeve ABU/OCP undershirt and long sleeve turtleneck are authorized. Cloth or silk screen unit designation emblems on the ABU/OCP undershirts are authorized within the parameters of 36-2903, "...to be worn on the left side of chest no to exceed 5 inches in diameter."
3. Para 6.1.10 – *The Sage Green Fleece or Coyote Brown Fleece (OCP)* is authorized to be worn indoors by all members, only as necessary.
4. Para 7.1.9.1 – The Sage Green Watch Cap, Coyote Brown Watch Cap, and the Black Watch Cap are authorized to be worn with authorized outer garments and the PTU.
5. Para 7.1.7.1 – When wearing the PTU and participating in both organized and individual physical training, members are authorized and may elect to wear a "solid black or dark blue baseball/sports cap with the Air Force symbol or U.S. Air Force printed/embroidered on the front." Caps will only be worn outdoors.
6. AETC Supplement 1 Para 2.8 – All Non-Prior Service (NPS) Airmen attending initial skills training at Ft. Meade are not authorized to mix official Air Force PTU with civilian attire while on or off duty. The exception to this policy is participation in sanctioned detachment/squadron events or intramural sports with commander approval. The wear of any part of the official Air Force PTU will be worn as an entire uniform and not mixed with civilian clothing.
